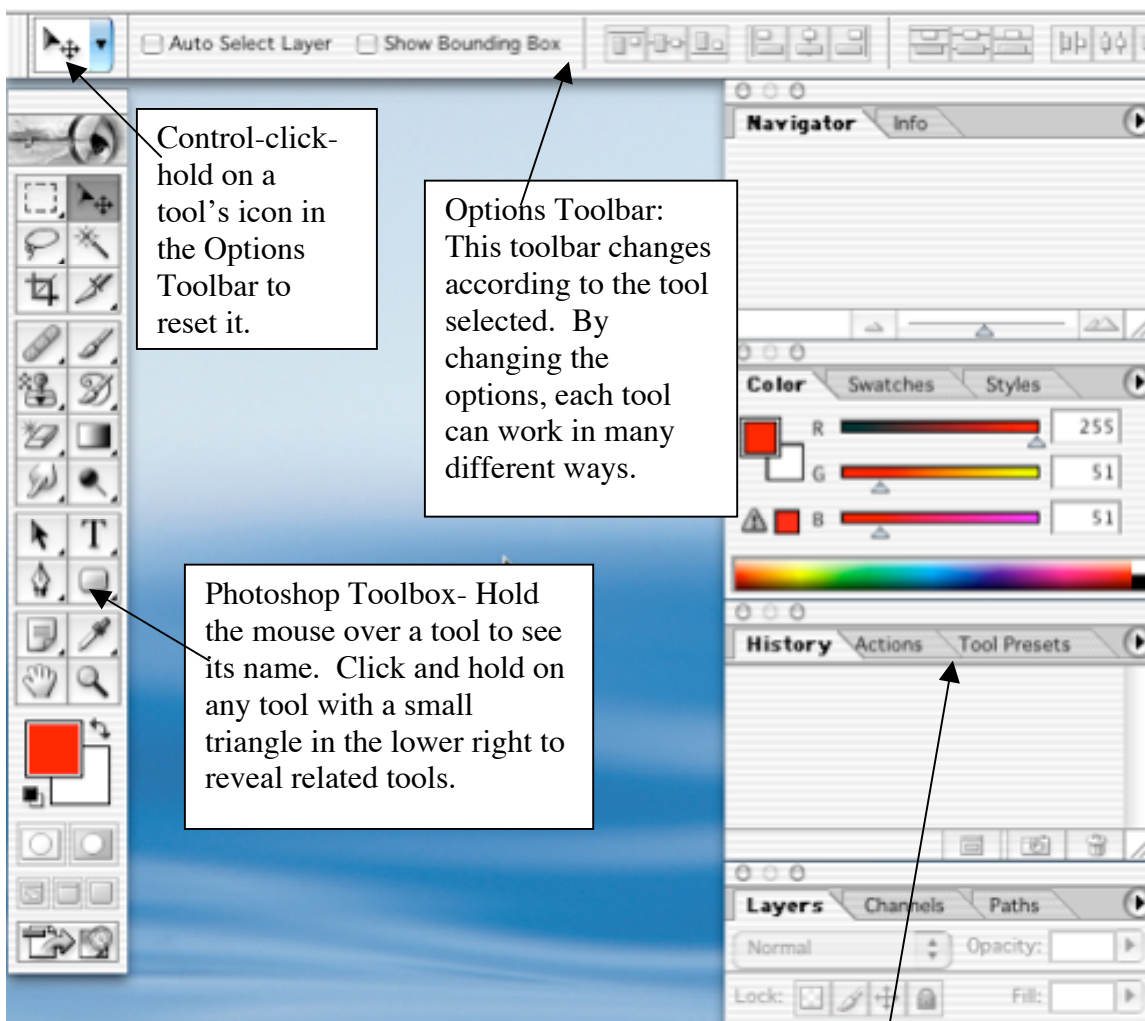


## Adobe Photoshop 7.0 The Desktop

The default Photoshop Desktop contains the Options Toolbar (top) Toolbox (left), and 4 palettes (right). If your desktop does not look like the picture below, you can reset it by going to the Window Menu and selecting Workspace/Reset Palette locations.



The Options Toolbar will change according to the tool selected in the Toolbox.

Default Palettes: From top to bottom- Navigator, Color, History, and Layers.

See a tool's name by placing the mouse over its Toolbox icon. Holding the mouse down on any tool with a triangle in its lower right hand corner reveals more, related tools. To reset any tool, control-click its icon in the Options Toolbar.

# The Toolbox

**Rectangular and Elliptical Marquee Tools:** Create rectangular and elliptical shaped selections. Holding down the shift key while dragging makes perfect circles or squares.

**Lasso Tools:** Use the Polygon Lasso to select irregular polygons by clicking on corners. Use the Lasso to make a free-hand selection. The Magnetic Lasso allows the computer to determine the perimeter of the object.

**Healing Brush:** Copies color and texture from a designated spot. Repairs images.

**Crop Tool:** Crops images.

**Clone Stamp and Pattern Stamp Tool:** Clone designated areas and patterns.

**Eraser Tool:** Erases pixels on the selected layer. Adjust size and shape of the eraser using the Options Toolbar. Use the Background and Magic Erasers to erase backgrounds.

**Blur, Smudge and Sharpen Tools:** Blur and Smudge tools soften pixels. Sharpen Tool increases pixel contrast.

**Foreground and Background squares.** Click on one to choose a color. Paint tools will use selected foreground colors.

**Move Tool:** Moves selected pixels or layers.

**Magic Wand:** Selects pixels of similar color. Set the tolerance in the Options Palette to adjust the amount of color variation allowed in each selection.

**Brush Tool and Pencil Tool:** Paint and draw with many options.

Use the History Brush to paint with a past state of an image. Use the Art History Brush to paint with special effects and textures.

**Gradient and Paint Bucket Tools:** The Gradient Tool paints gradients on a document or selection. The Paint Bucket pours color into similarly colored adjacent pixels.

**Dodge, Burn and Sponge Tools:** Experiment with these tools to lighten, darken, or change the saturation of an image's color.

**Type Tool:** Type horizontal and vertical text.

**Magnifying Glass:** Zooms in and out of the document.

**Eyedropper:** Samples colors from the image. Use it to match colors.
